Castle Hill

Across the heart of the Castle Hill and the Old Moorish district – where you will find the origins of Fado – the soundtrack of Lisbon.



African Presence

Inside what was once the biggest slave district of Europe with a particular attention to the life of the slaves in the metropolis and the spice trade.



Lisbon of the Discoveries

Lisbon assumes an important role as a pioneer of globalization in the age of the discoveries. How was Lisbon and its people back then?



Secret & Historical Shops

Unique shops (new and old) ranging from clothes to gloves, handicraft to newspapers, bookshops, pastries and many other surprising locations.



Masonic Lisbon

Lisbon was recreated as a Masonic temple after the earthquake. The signs and the evidence of the fact left a strong mark on the cityscape.

Revelation Tour



Simply the first thing to do in Lisbon because it provides an all-in-one overview of the main city sites and some well kept secrets, exposing you instantly to the special atmosphere and authenticity that make up the character of this vibrant Atlantic city.

- Baixa – the new city built after the Earthquake

Old Town



The old district of Alfama, sitting on the hill facing the river, still exhibits strong references to maritime activities. Resisting the threat of gentrification, its inhabitants maintain a unique lifestyle, with a strong sense of community, influenced by the urban density and the narrowness of the streets, preserving this district like a small village inside the big city.

Chiado & Bairro Alto



The cosmopolitan and literary Chiado, together with the bohemian Bairro Alto and the life and personality of the best known player of the modernist generation in Portugal - the poet Fernando Pessoa – provides the adequate script. For this tour you will also spot unique perspectives of the city, available only from Lisbon's most Romantic hill and the first to be seriously planned as an urban district in the 16th century.

Key topics:

- Bohemian life in Bairro Alto
- Lisbon growing outside its walls
- A Baroque splendour in the city
- The poet Fernando Pessoa
- "A Brasileira" and the Modernist Generation
- The golden age of the newspapers



Legends & Mysteries



In addition to facts, the 3200 years of the city's historical records contain many secrets, legends and myths. On this walk you will delve into some of the most curious ones and will become acquainted with the most intriguing characters, including some of whom the city is not so proud of.

- Ulysses - the founder of Lisbon ?
- St. Vincent and the Ravens
- The young martyrs of Lisbon
- Saint Anthony, the matchmaker
- Gusmão's flying device (the Passarola)

City of Spies



Portugal remained neutral in the 2nd World War and Lisbon became a rendezvous spot for spies, taking advantage of the city's strategic Atlantic connections. Inside the city both the Allies and the Axis kept impressive diplomatic services: probably the only place in war-torn Europe where all sides were able to meet on equal grounds.

- The refugees and the European fashion trends
- The lonely fight of the Portuguese consul in Bordeaux
- The most important WWII double agent: Garbo/Arabel
- The story of the real James Bond
